
YOU are invited to the Hatton Village Plan Implementation Group AGM

PARISH COUNCIL'S SPENDING ACTIVITIES - THE FINAL PART OF THE TRILOGY

The Hatton Village Plan identified five broad areas under which we wanted to enhance village life. They are **Environment; Community and Social Activities; Communications; Services and Transport and Road Safety.**

The Communications Group has worked hard to establish our new **website** with associated **Twitter** and **Facebook** links. The website is the 'must go to' place to find up to date information about opportunities and issues within the village. The email address is becoming well used with feedback from residents being very positive. We also listened to you about the number of **newsletters** you were receiving from different sources and so we have tried to actively manage this by producing a monthly, quality newsletter. (Thanks to Nikki and Carl Palmer for printing). We hope you value this regular communication. Information, though, is a two way process and if you would like to put something of interest for the majority of residents in the newsletter please email hattonvillage@gmail.com. Finally, in this area of work, you will by now have seen our new **Village Notice Board** in the centre of the village. (Thanks to Debbie and David Weir for allowing it to be sited on their land). We hope you think it is going to be a valuable vehicle through which we can continue to keep you well informed. The Parish Council's spending in this area has been just under £1000 but this was supplemented by a successful grant of £1000 from WBC. (Well done Margaret Winstanley for putting the bid together).

Many of you will remember our successful meeting with the Police and the then Police and Crime Commissioner at the Lewis Carroll Centre on 24th February, 2016. Following that meeting we relaunched **Rural Watch and Home Watch**, and with this newsletter you will have received an information card to keep to hand or place in a window so that we can tell all we are part of a network of good neighbours. The card provides you with all relevant contacts to help keep our area crime free. We have spent just under £100 to provide you with this valuable resource and we hope you think it is money well used. The important message is that we are being well supported by the Police, and Steve Parr, our **PCSO**, is working hard on our behalf to ensure our safety. He led the implementation of **Operation Shield** providing us with a DNA property marking system.

The Transport and Road Safety Group has not yet required any financial support but they are having a significant impact. An article in next month's newsletter will reveal all.

Temporary Road Closure

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Warrington Borough Council has made an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of driving on Warrington Road from its junction with Old Chester Road to its junction with Park Lane. This will be effective from Monday 13th June 2016 for 3 weeks as and when the signs are in place on site. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works. The alternative route will be via Old Chester Road, Chester Road, Park Lane and vice versa. The closure is required to allow The Bridgewater Canal Company to carry out brickwork repairs to Walton Bridge.
