## LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

As you will be aware, Warrington BC have published their Local Development Plan to meet projected housing and employment targets over the next 20 years, with two significant developments requiring release of greenbelt : South West – Moore/Walton ‘South-West Extension’ 2000 homes, South East – Stretton/Appleton Thorn ‘Garden City Suburb’ of 9000 homes, as well as the Western Link. These developments would impact significantly on Hatton village due to the additional traffic which would be created. Hatton Lane and Warrington Road would become corridors of traffic for drivers seeking the shortest route to the Western Link.

Consultation is now underway – many of you will have attended sessions over the last few weeks. An additional date has just been added – see key dates below:-
