SOUTH WARRINGTON DRAFT PLAN

Hatton Parish Council has joined forces with the other 8 Parish Councils in the South Warrington area to act on behalf of residents. The Draft Local Plan will probably be issued in December this year. The Plan will show future proposals for residential and other forms of development over the next 20 years in South Warrington.



Regular meetings are held to discuss what action the Parish Councils will take and a Planning Consultant John Groves of Groves Town Planning has been appointed to provide advice.



Whilst the Parish Councils are able to cover likely costs, a crowd funding scheme has just been introduced by Re-thinking South Warringtons' Future, an organisation working closely with the Parish Councils.

We will provide updates on what is happening in future editions of Hatton Life.
