### **PLANNING UPDATE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL**

**New House Farm Development.** The Application to build 31 new houses was refused by the Borough Council Development Committee on the grounds of the lack of sustainability especially the affordable housing content of the scheme. During the meeting it was pointed out by a Councillor that Hatton is a remote location and in the main residents need to use private cars to access schools, shops and other amenities.

**Warrington Local Plan.** There have been two on-line presentations of the alternative Local Plan being promoted by the South Warrington Parish Council Group. Entitled A New Plan for a Changing World both presentations attracted a substantial audience. Further information can be seen on the Grappenhall and Thelwall Parish Council website

**Hatton Lane Shrub Beds.** Work has begun on the shrub beds on Hatton Lane, these beds were overgrown, unmanageable and caused poor visibility. Heavy tractors were needed to do the job, and have left the area looking worse for wear. In the next couple of weeks the area will be levelled, re-turfed and the surrounds for the new beds put in place. The planting of the new beds has been designed to give maximum visibility and to look good all year round, however the planting may now be delayed until spring. The council have taken great care to ensure that the two Paper Bark trees will not be effected by the work being carried out. Many thanks to David and Sally Anne Tate for all the time and hard work taken to do this.
