### Ultra-Fast Broadband in Hatton

The Parish Council would like to send a huge thank you to all residents who have sent their support for the Community Fibre Partnership, to install an Ultrafast Fibre Optic Broadband network in Hatton. **However, we still need many more registrations to meet the government target for the funding.** As a gentle reminder please can those who wish to support this initiative respond as soon as possible, as we need to get the number of registrations to the required level very soon. The households that have not registered thus far will have received a leaflet containing additional information which you may find useful. We urge you to respond as this opportunity cannot be repeated, and the whole initiative will be dropped, with the funding going elsewhere should we fail to get sufficient support. ### Warrington Local Plan

In the next few days you will have a leaflet posted through your door which has been prepared by the South Warrington Parishes ( SWP) Working Party, which relates to the latest version of Warrington's Local Plan and covers the period until 2038. **It is vitally important that you read this leaflet and that you send your objection to Warrington BC before the 15<sup>th</sup> November, the deadline date.**

There are public exhibitions where plans can be examined and your questions answered. The dates and venues of these exhibitions are set out in the leaflet.

This new plan gives the impression that some of the proposals in the previous Plan have been removed or watered down. **In truth they have not, but the areas for development have been moved nearer to Hatton.**

They are still proposing that 4,200 houses are built on what is now Green Belt Land which is totally unacceptable as they have had little regard to the availability of 'Brown field' sites within or close to the Town Centre!

The proposed development will obviously have a detrimental effect on the Air Quality in this area as well as the loss of amenity land. The current Infrastructure is already broken so the added pressure of 4,200 further houses will be catastrophic!

On top of that the plan includes huge areas of green belt to be used for Employment purposes!

The SWP working group are formulating an Objection with the help of a Professional Town Planner but it is vital that residents make sure their voices are heard. Details of where you send your objections are set out in the leaflet.

A huge Sycamore tree at the end of Goose Lane has been declared dangerous by the Tree Preservation Officer. The tree is reputed to be one of, if not the largest Sycamore in Cheshire, but public safety is at risk as the tree is dying and large branches have been falling off. The tree is due to be felled on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> October, for you own safety please avoid this area while the work is being carried out.
