### Conservation Area for Hatton?

At September's Parish Council Meeting Planning Consultant John Groves gave a presentation on Conservation Areas so that the Council could consider whether one might be appropriate in Hatton. There are already some Listed Buildings and some Locally Listed Buildings in Hatton. Notes from the presentation which give more information will be put on Hatton Life website for residents to see. ### Road Safety

A number of residents have contacted the Parish Council in recent weeks voicing their concerns with regard to the speed of some vehicles in and around the village. Although, in most instances this relates to non-residents passing through the area, it has been observed that this is not always the case. We would like to politely remind all residents, to adhere to the speed limits within the area, and also ask that caution be taken when passing riders, dog walkers, cyclists etc.

### Creamfields De-Briefing

Two members of the Parish Council attended the meeting in October which was chaired by Andy Carter MP. The meeting was very well attended, by local parish councillors, residents of Hatton, Daresbury, Stretton, Walton and Moore, John Probert (Festival Republic) and the representative for the Cheshire Police and Crime Commissioner. All residents had an opportunity to raise any concerns or issues to the organisers (Festival Republic). The meeting was a very positive one, and we believe that all resident's concerns were taken seriously, and that processes will now be put in place to ensure that we do not have a repeat of the road traffic issues and security issues that arose during this year's festival. There will be a further meeting in the New Year with members of all Parish Councils affected by the festival, all information will be relayed to residents via the Parish Council website as and when it is received. This will also include advance notice of the road and traffic plan, and the opportunity for this to be consulted on with John Probert (Festival Republic). John has also confirmed that there will not be a car park on Warrington Road next year and festival goers will not be able to access Creamfields via this route. A representative for the Cheshire Police and Crime Commissioner, who also attended the meeting will be taking up the concerns regarding the 'scavengers' and the negative impact they have during the clear up, directly to the Police Commissioner.
