You may have noticed the presence of Openreach in the village recently which was for the survey stages of our Community Fibre Project. It is great to see the project starting to progress and we will provide regular updates. However please note that **Freedom Fibre** are marketing the possibility of fibre broadband in some nearby areas, and should they target Hatton, please be aware that they are **NOT** related to our Openreach Full-Fibre Network project, and any take-up could jeopardise the voucher-based funding position.

There were no reported enforcements on Hatton Lane or Warrington Road in June.

Residents will have noticed a Speed Indicator device which was deployed on Warrington Road last month. The device was deployed to collect vehicle speed data for that section of Warrington Road.

The average speed captured was 26mph and the highest speed captured was 49mph.
